

## PBA Challenge Doubles League

Our league is licensed by the PBA to bowl on the 5 oil patterns used on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour.

In principle this league is identical to any other scratch doubles league, the difference is found in the lane conditions.

Most leagues bowl on lane conditions that are designed to be forgiving: they are designed to be easy. THS conditions place around 90% of the oil in the middle of the lane to guide misdirected shots back towards the pocket, often resulting in strikes from bad shots. This takes away a lot of the skill in bowling and for many it also takes away the fun.

PBA patterns are designed to challenge bowler's abilities of accuracy and versatility. We have 5 different oil patterns which are all different lengths and require different skills to be mastered to attain high scores.

### Cycle 5/5 - Viper Pattern (37ft)

The Viper Pattern is one of the most difficult patterns that PBA Experience bowlers will face.

At 37ft in length there is little hold in the middle of the lane, forcing bowlers into the track area. There is also little recovery from the outside boards, so bowlers are forced into playing quite parallel target lines to get the ball consistently to the breakpoint.

Even rolling and consistent equipment are required from the start, with a switch to higher response balls as the carrydown develops.

Bowlers succeeding on Viper need to be in control of all facets of their game.
